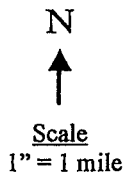

EXPLANATION

Each monument record is identified by a numerical-alphabetical index or coordinate number which is related to the township diagram above. For example, the quarter corner common to sections 4 and 5 would have the coordinate number 9-X. See item 7 on monument record.

Monuments which are not located at intersecting lines on the above diagram are identified by reference to the nearest decimal division of the spaces, with the decimal values increasing to the right and upward; e.g. 1.7-C, 8-M.3, 6.2-T.5.

A monument which is common to adjoining townships will be identified by the coordinates in the township in which the record is to be filed, except in the case where a county boundary coincides with a township line, in which case an appropriate coordinate number shall be used for each county involved.

Within each township file, the records shall be inserted in numerical-alphabetical order from top to bottom.
